## **Administrator's Report**

## Elementary Principal's Report

Mrs. Heidenwith reported 95.3% attendance for September in the Elementary with 147 students enrolled. The first round of walkthroughs have been completed and Mrs. Heidenwith has started the initial round of formal observations. Mid-benchmark assessments are in-progress. Teachers completed Dyslexia Training on October 3<sup>rd</sup>. Tutoring has started; 37 Elementary students are currently being served. Mrs. Logsdon started a walking club for 3<sup>rd</sup>- 5<sup>th</sup> grade students. Grandparents Day was a success. The MAP field trip for 4<sup>th</sup>- 8<sup>th</sup> grade students that scored proficient or advanced was October 8<sup>th</sup>. They will be recognized at a home basketball game on October 21<sup>st</sup>. The end of 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter was October 14<sup>th</sup>. Parent/Teacher conferences will be October 16<sup>th</sup>.

Office referrals were discussed. Star Early Literacy/Star Reading Data and Star Math Data were discussed.

## High School Principal's Report

Mr. Halley presented overall attendance of 95% and enrollment of 122 students in September. Behavior reports were discussed. Star Data and Grade Reports were discussed.

Mr. Halley presented an update on High School events and activities. There are 14 players in Baseball with a record of 4-7 and 2-4 in Conference. There are 14 players in Softball with a record of 10-7 and 5-3 in Conference. FFA has 14 trapshooting participants and finished 10<sup>th</sup> place at Districts. There are 31 members in Band. Band marched in the Pancake Day Parade placing 2<sup>nd</sup> and marched in the Milan Parade. There are 10 participants in Drama. The Art Club has 46 members. Junior High Boys Basketball has 13 players, Junior High Girls Basketball has 7 players, and Junior High Cheerleading has 11 participants.

Mr. Halley continues formal and informal classroom evaluations. Nineteen students visited MACC and 15 students attended the Truman College Fair. Mr. Halley shared a calendar of events for October. Green City hosted the Health Care Career Day organized by Sullivan County Hospital. Ten schools and approximately 75 students attended.

# Superintendent Report

Tennille Banner gave an update on the District.

• The new door for the back High School entrance is scheduled for installation.

- The new Access Control System will be installed with no further cost to the district beginning this week.
- Mrs. Banner and Jim Thomas met with a representative from Midwest Transit regarding
  the "new" bus and all of the issues it has. The representative will be talking to his
  superiors to find a satisfactory resolution. The bus has been taken to their shop for a
  complete diagnostic review. The second newest bus for the district has had the
  transmission replaced for a second time and will be returning soon.
- The APR Data will be released November 6<sup>th</sup>. This is a snapshot of how the district is performing.
- A MAP-A onsite review will be performed in the next couple of weeks.
- Board members need to complete the annual MARE Board Training.
- FFA applied for a grant from Smithfield and is awaiting confirmation.
